2. Visit MIk's website to find home activities related to financial literacy to do at home with your child.
3. Students are expected to make weekly or monthly contributions to their banks.
4. Together, parents and the student should set a goal on opening or adding to an existing bank account for the student.
5. Parents should plan to be a part of the Lemonade Day Classroom Competition on Monday, April 23rd. You can help by securing sales and inviting co-workers, friends and relatives to stop by your child's classroom to purchase a cup of lemonade. The cost of one cup of lemonade is 25 cents. The classroom with the most lemonade sales will receive a $\$ 250$ gift certific a te to purchase items for their c la ssroom.
6. In accordance with our philosophy of helping students understand giving back to the community, each classroom will choose a non-profit orga nization to donate/invest their ea mings.
7. Financial literacy concepts and activities will be integrated into curent themes used for instruction.
